String Art

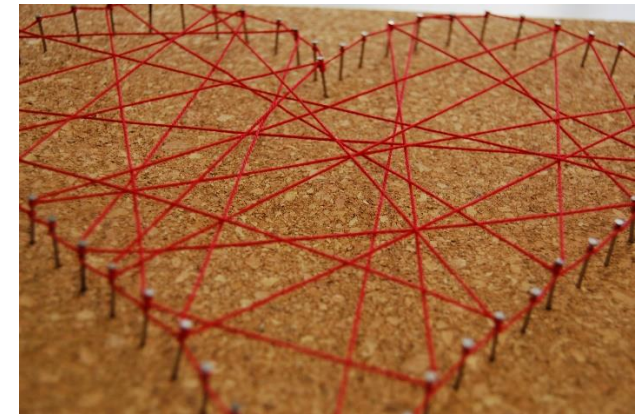

String Art Basics

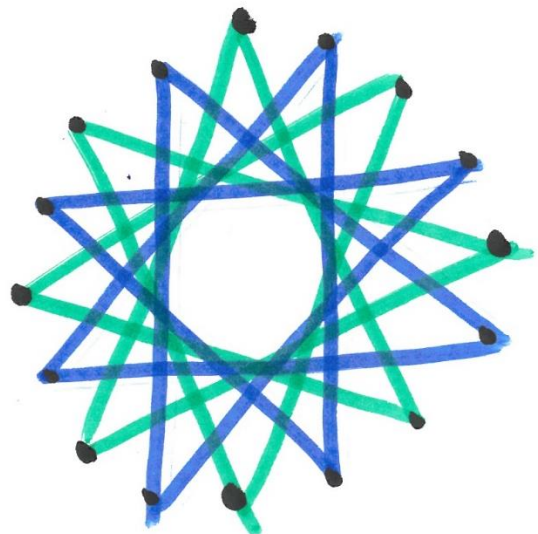
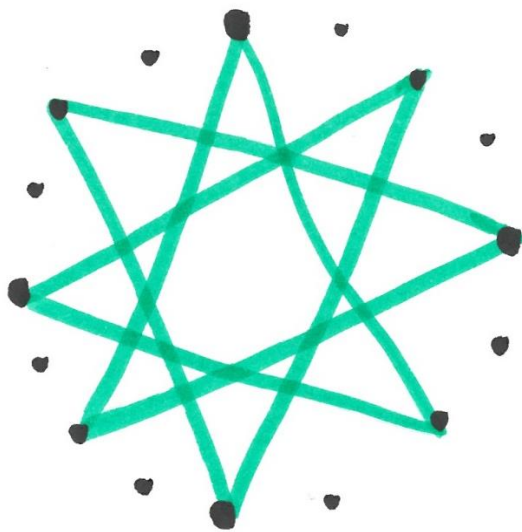
String art uses string, thread or thin wire strung between a grid of points to create geometric patterns, pictures or shapes.

Materials:

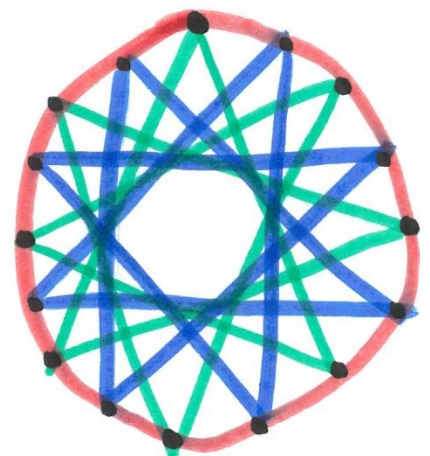
- Flat piece of wood (we chose coasters)
- Small tacks/nails
- Ball of string (various colours optional)
- Felt tip marker
- Hammer

How to Start:

- On your backing board mark a circle with 16 dots. This can be easily done by drawing 4 dots as pictured right and then add dots halfway between these dots and then halfway again.
- Hammer in a nail on each of the dots
- Tie off one end of your string to the topmost nail.
- Working in a clockwise direction. Count 6 nails around and loop the string around it before counting to the next 6th nail and looping around it keeping the string tight.
- Repeat until you end up back at the nail you started on. Tie off the string and trim both ends.
- Grab another piece of string and repeat the process until all the nails have been used.



- (Optional) To make a border around your design tie the string onto one of the nails and then loop it around the 2nd nail and back to the 1st.
- From the 1st nail wind it around the 3rd nail and then loop around the 2nd nail and to the 4th nail, continuing in this pattern until you get back to the start.
