Candle Making

Basic Candle Making

A simple and cheap way to personalize your candles.

Tools:

- Plain white candles
- Pack of Crayola coloured wax crayons
- Essential oil (scent of your choosing)
- Wicks
- Candle containers (glass jars, drinking glasses, shot glass etc.)
- Eyedropper
- Microwave safe bowl
- Paddlepops (to stir)
- Label (optional)
- Pegs (to hold wicks)



How to start:

- 1. Cut up/grate plain candle
- 2. Cut and grate crayon (Note colours will be muted unless you double/triple up the same colour)
- 3. Boil the jug and place scented oil bottle in 1-2cm hot water to warm up the oil (this is so the oil doesn't evaporate when going from cold to hot wax)
- 4. Put wax and crayon in microwave safe bowl
- 5. Microwave for 1 minute and stir
- 6. Microwave and stir at 30-second intervals until wax fully melts
- 7. Use a drop of hot wax to secure wick into the bottom of the candle jar. For a tumbler sized candle either twist/plait three wicks tighter or add wicks equal distance around the jar.
- 8. Add 3mls of essential oil to the wax and stir well
- 9. Pour hot wax into moulds and leave to set (24hrs minimum)
- 10. Trim the wick down to size (approx. 1cm long)

N.B. – taper wicks won't burn enough wax to prevent the candle being "swamped" so three wicks are used unless thicker wicks are used.
